Dual Credit Definition

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The Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board (THECB) defines dual credit as a system in which an eligible high school student enrolls in college course(s) and receives credit for the course(s) from both the college and high school. Dual credit courses may be taught on the high school campus by an approved instructor or on the college campus. Dual credit courses include both academic and technical courses.

Intentions for Cost of Dual Credit

At the present time, CISD plans to pay for all dual credit classes taken during the school day at YHS or TBI. This is dependent upon funding. If something were to change, you will be notified before you take the course.

Dual Credit Courses are Transferable to Most Public Four-Year Colleges and Universities in Texas





Students are responsible for determining if transfer institution will accept their credits

Sometimes courses in your major must be taken there

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1. If you fail the class or withdraw before finishing, the entire cost becomes the family's responsibility. This year each class was about

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2. Don't take on more than you can handle. You may have to recover credits to graduate from high school.

(recorded on high school & college transcripts)

*High school required credits must be recovered.

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3. Choose your classes wisely. Talk to someone in admissions about the transference of credits.

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4. If your plan is to go to a highly selective, ivy league, out of state, or private school, these credits may not transfer. Make sure you are keeping your college search in mind.

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5. Family Educational Rights & Privacy Act FERPA

- Federal law that ensures privacy of student educational records (begins when student starts college regardless of age)
- Temple College instructors cannot share grades, course schedules, test scores, etc. with parents
- A great opportunity for students to learn the college process and take on new responsibilities
- Have your student give you their login info or have them look up their grade online and show you

6. Junior college athletes might talk to your recruiter before taking too many courses.

7. If you are trying to get into a competitive program (nursing, dental hygienist, etc.) your dual credit grades may be counted for prerequisites. You may have to retake classes if you make lower grades.

Dual Credit & YHS GPA

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The dual credit classes listed on the next slide are the only ones which count toward GPA. These will figure on the Tier IV scale. This is all documented in our local board policy.



- 4. Step 4: Create Account: Fill in your Name, Email, Cell Phone" etc.
- 5. Step S: Bottom of Create Account Page: "Enrollment Information" Entry Term: Term you are starting school at TC. "Admit Type": Drop down please select: "Dual Credit (receiving both high school and college credit" Under "Academic Trogram" Drop down please select: "High School Undecided --AA" and Account Information: Choose a Password and Confirm that password, Click "Create Account."
- 6. Step 6: Personal information: Fill in your information all the way to the bottom of this page

- No Cameron ISD representative, including the counselor, can guarantee a seat will be available.
- 8 Weeks long
- Only supervised-no guidance

5 Considerations for Online Dual Credit Classes

1. Are you an online learner?

- -email effectively
- -deadlines
- -time management
- -knows how to reach out for help
- -supervised, but progress not necessarily monitored

5 Considerations for Online DC Classes continued

2. Current course load

- -remember 12 college credit hours is considered a full time college student, without other high school classes
- -how much extra-curricular time will be involved
- -college classes are more rigorous

Considerations for Online Dual Credit Classes

3. Financial liability

-It is CISD's intention to pay for approved dual credit courses. (Although this is not a guarantee from year-to-year.)

-If a class is dropped or failed, the family is responsible for repaying CISD.

-are you sure the classes will transfer for needed credits



- II. Once you have disclosed your disability and requested accommodations with the OSA coordinator, you will be provided the following forms to complete:
 - Request for Documentation of Disability and Disability Documentation Guideline paperwork
 - Depending on the disability, current documentation may need to be updated annually
- III. Once you have obtained the required disability documentation, you will need to schedule an appointment with the OSA coordinator to complete the following forms:
 - 1. Application for Services Form
 - 2. Accommodations Request Form
 - 3. Student Disability Handbook Acknowledgment Page
 - 4. Permission to Collect Information
- IV. Once all documentation is complete, the coordinator and student will decide which accommodations are reasonable and appropriate. The coordinator will write a letter specifying those accommodations. The letter will be then emailed to the student and to all requested instructors. It is the student's responsibility to ask for letters of accommodation every semester. It is recommended that all requests be turned in at least 2 weeks before the start of classes. If you have any questions, please contact the accommodations coordinator.
